

Wales

- In 2008, 133 people were newly diagnosed with HIV in Wales
- Between 1998 and 2008, the annual rate of HIV diagnoses increased by over 300%
- Between 2003 and 2008, the annual rate of HIV diagnoses increased by 22%

- In 2007, 1009 people needed HIV care in Wales *
- Between 2002 and 2007 the number of people needing care for HIV more than doubled (468/1009)
- Including the 28% of people with HIV in the region who remain undiagnosed, there were an estimated total of 1462 people living with HIV in Wales in 2008

* figures for people receiving HIV Care in Wales in 2008 not yet available

- Between 2002 and 2007, numbers of new diagnoses of:
 - syphilis rose 200%
 - chlamydia rose 29%
 - gonorrhoea rose 9%
