#### DEAR FRIEND,

It is my pleasure to welcome you to The Auction 2021. It's hard to believe that the first Auction was back in 1996 – we have you to thank for its continued success.

This year things are slightly different, and we're not able to gather together as we would usually. However, I hope that you're able to join us for our virtual Auction and look forward to us being together again when it is safe for us to do so.

Recently, Channel 4's powerful drama from Russell T Davies, *It's a Sin*, has shown us we've come a long way since its depiction of HIV and AIDS in the 80s and 90s. We've seen incredible advances in prevention, testing and treatment, but society's view of HIV still remains riddled with myth and stigma. We need to continue to work hard to get the real facts about HIV out to everyone.



The media coverage that the programme has generated has helped us to the best National HIV Testing Week ever. We've sent out more HIV tests self tests, and I'm excited for the future and confident we can end HIV transmissions by 2030.

But it's also taken me back to those times. I'd only just started having sex and exploring my sexuality when the homophobic newspaper headlines began, blaming and demonising us, calling it a 'gay plague'. For a long time a blanket of fear affected all of us across the gay community.

I mentioned earlier that 1996 was the year of the first ever Auction. For me, it was a momentous year in another way – it was when I received my HIV diagnosis at the age of 30. I was told I'd probably be dead by the time I was 40. I took 18 tablets a day with horrendous side effects. The difference in treatment now is beyond measure. I take 4 tablets a day (some people just take 1), with no side effects.

I turned to Terrence Higgins Trust when I needed help with my diagnosis. Counselling gave me tools to use to keep my mental health on track through the ups and downs. I know first-hand that support services like counselling play such a vital role and help people cope with stigma. They are truly a lifeline to so many people living with HIV.

This year, your support counts so much. The pandemic has meant that we haven't been able to fundraise in our usual ways but demand for our counselling has shot up by 57%. We've continued to offer it online to everyone who needs it. Stopping HIV transmissions is within sight, and we won't stop until no one else is diagnosed with HIV. But until then, I don't want anyone else to face a diagnosis alone. With your help, we can make sure they don't.

We extend our special thanks to our Auction Committee who remain tenacious in their efforts to secure the amazing lots this year, drawing on their networks and skills that in turn enable us to continue to deliver our services and support those who need us.

My final thanks goes to every one of you taking part in this year's virtual Auction. We are indebted to you for your support and remain humbled by your extraordinary kindness and generosity.

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# OUR UNIQUE OPPORTUNITY TO END HIV TRANSMISSIONS

'They say if something seems too good to be true then it usually is. But, in the case of ending HIV cases in England within the next decade, that ambition is as good as it sounds: we can achieve a world first by ending new transmissions by 2030.'

In 2019 an independent process called the **HIV Commission** was set up by the country's leading HIV charities: Terrence Higgins Trust, National AIDS Trust and Elton John AIDS Foundation. Its goal was to the answer the question: **how can we end new cases of HIV in England by 2030?** 

The HIV Commission has drawn on the ideas and experience of people living with HIV, businesses, the voluntary sector and the public. The Commissioners are high-profile people who were chosen for their expertise, experience and independence.

HIV Commissioner Gareth Thomas CBE said: 'I want to be a part of a positive change and play a role in driving us towards our goal where no-one else contracts HIV.'

On World AIDS Day 2020 we secured a commitment from the UK government to take the Commission's recommendations on board and help us to make this goal a reality.

### WHAT ARE THE KEY HIV COMMISSION RECOMMENDATIONS?

**Test, test, test** - HIV testing must become routine across the health service

**HIV stigma** – tackle the stigma around HIV in society and healthcare settings

**Inequality** – address health inequalities and barriers to testing and treatment

**Innovate** – build a healthcare system that can take advantage of innovation

**Leadership** – strong leadership, resources and partnerships

### WHY WE MUST END NEW CASES OF HIV BY 2030

Ending HIV transmissions in England by 2030 is not just a government target but has the potential to change lives for many.

At the moment nearly 3,000 people a year are newly diagnosed. Achieving this goal will prevent tens of thousands of new infections and all the complications that can follow including mental health challenges, medical complications, and living with stigma and discrimination.

The worryingly high number of late HIV diagnoses is bad for patients, results in more progressed disease, leads to new preventable transmissions and impacts public finances. The HIV Commission highlights that every case of late diagnosis must be looked into and investigated, so we can ensure it doesn't happen again.

#### WHY IS HIV TESTING SO IMPORTANT?

HIV testing reduces the number of people with undiagnosed and late diagnosed HIV. Testing is a cornerstone of combination prevention, as newly diagnosed people can get onto treatment straight away and ensure they can live well and prevent onward transmission of HIV.

It's estimated that, currently, **around 5,900 people** in England are living with undiagnosed HIV, which drastically increases the chance of unwittingly passing this virus on.

Someone with a late diagnosis has an eight times greater risk of death in the first year compared to those diagnosed promptly.

#### MAKE EVERY CONTACT COUNT

The Commission made it clear that the single most important intervention to meet the 2030 goal is widespread HIV testing. By making testing routine across the NHS, we can make every contact count.

Every blood test done that is not also used as a chance to test for undiagnosed HIV is an

opportunity missed. No longer should people leave a sexual health clinic without being offered an HIV test – last year alone over half a million eligible people were not tested in sexual health clinics. Testing needs to become standard practice when registering for a GP, at cervical screenings, in pharmacies and in accident and emergency departments. We know this system works. It's been a key part of maternity services where opt-out testing is routine for pregnant women and there is now a 99% testing coverage. This has led to almost no babies being born with HIV in England.

In recent years we have seen a continued fall in new HIV diagnoses and this is to be celebrated. But it's crucial that the momentum behind our efforts is maintained to achieve the nation's goal of zero new HIV cases by 2030.

Salgado graduated with an MA in Fine Art from Chelsea College of Art in 2009, and currently lives and works in London, UK.

Salgado's most recent solo exhibition *Strange Weather* took place in London at BEERS in October 2020 and was his 15th sell-out exhibition. He has shown his work extensively and worldwide including cities such as London, New York, Cape Town, Basel, Zagreb, Toronto, and Miami to name a few.

In 2017, Salgado was the youngest artist to receive a survey-exhibition at The Canadian High Commission in London. In March 2019, he entered the secondary market with a piece in a Strauss & Co auction in South Africa that doubled its estimate.

Salgado's paintings have been collected extensively in both private and public collections, including the Government of Canada, the Jordanian Royal Family, Simmons & Simmons, and the Esquinazi Collection.



# PATRICK HUGHES RAINBOWS, 2020

Patrick Hughes lives and works in London. He is widely recognised as one of the major painters of contemporary British art. His solo show in 1961 was the first by a British Pop Artist. He taught at Leeds College of Art in the 1960s and has been exhibiting with Flowers Gallery for the last forty years. His work is in several private and public collections including the British Council, the Victoria & Albert Museum and the Print Collection at the Tate Gallery.

*Rainbows* is Hughes' most recent screenprint. Hughes finds the rainbow image ideal to work with. In nature they are rare and ephemeral, but Hughes's rainbows are schematic, flat and malleable, often humorous and here in *Rainbows*, impenetrable.

### ALIX DE **BRETAGNE**



Alix de Bretagne FRSA is a London based conceptual artist, human rights activist and a Fellow of the Royal Society of Arts.

In this readymade, de Bretagne contemplates the impact of PrEP in the fight against HIV. As we observe the blue PrEP pill in a frame, de Bretagne invites us to see beyond the physical, and to think about the implications of its existence.

Alix de Bretagne says: "It is not just a pill. It represents the unfulfilled hope of so many we have lost in the fight against HIV; it represents the hope in the eyes of those left to carry on with the fight; it represents the hope in the veins of countless family and friends who have marched alongside our community; it represents the hope in the soul of all of us who are moved to action. It's not just a blue pill: it is hope."

# CONRAD SHAWCROSS, RA STUDY FOR TRUNCATION SEQUENCE, 2018

Black painted weathering steel Height 30cm x width 30cm x depth 30cm Edition 8 of 10

British artist Conrad Shawcross RA specialises in mechanical sculptures based on philosophical and scientific ideas. He is the youngest living member of the Royal Academy of Arts.

Study for Truncation Sequence continues Shawcross' exploration of the complex properties of the tetrahedron. Made of black painted steel, it is a study of the same interlocking cells that comprise the system for *The Dappled Light of the Sun* – the monumental first work within Shawcross' *Formations* series.

In Study for Truncation Sequence, a sequence of intermediary cells seamlessly cascade down in diminishing scale to produce a self-contained tetrahedral structure. The work is also concerned with ideas of growth, entropy and radical changes of scale, while attempting to maintain constant geometric proportion. Although Study for Truncation Sequence visualises the potentiality of linear progression, there is no dominant way in which its direction is read.





Rana Begum was born in Bangladesh in 1977, and lives and works in London. Begum studied at Slade School of Fine Art, and Chelsea College of Art and Design. Her work blurs the boundaries between sculpture, painting and architecture while drawing from the urban landscape as well as geometric patterns from traditional Islamic art and architecture. She has exhibited in solo and group shows globally.

The piece stems from the installation at Cristea Roberts, No.947, 2019, a wall painting which was produced in response to the title *The* Interaction of Colour, which was based on Josef Albers influential art and design book published in 1963. The works shown in The Interaction of Colour exhibition demonstrate a simple but staggering use of colour, and trace over 50 years of Albers' influence.


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# FELIPE CHAVEZ WE ARE SAFER HERE, 2021

Felipe Chavez is a contemporary painter, born in Colombia and now working in London. Using Indian ink and water, he uses his own body to explore the male form and its relationship with sexuality and space as a gay man, alongside his own personal struggles to find where he belongs. By being open and revealing through his art, Chavez says he creates a sense of power and control over who he is and who he chooses to exhibit.


We Are Safer Here comes with a statement of security and vulnerability, whereby the models, though all physically resembling the artist, have taken identities of their own and have found sanctuary in the white walls of the narrative the artist has built for them.

The piece raises the question: 'Is the artist only safe when exposed and trapped inside imaginary walls?'

## SAM JACKSON EDEN, 2019

British artist Sam Jackson studied at Middlesex University and the Royal Academy of Art. Using images from disparate worlds across cultural staples – from DIY tattoos to Baroque and Renaissance painting – Jackson creates works that set a thought in motion, asking questions about what it is to be alive today.

Depicting his chosen environments with an ability that discloses the mystery and ambiguity surrounding them, he not only evokes physical places, but also the mental states, desires and anxieties that accompany him during his visits. They produce a sense of unease and tension but are at the same time mystical and bewildering landscapes.



### CONDITIONS OF BUSINESS ("Conditions")

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- Introduction:
  - These Conditions of Business govern the relationship between (i) you as the bidder and/or the buyer ("Bidder/Buyer" or "You" or "Yourself") of a lot or lots ("Works") offered by The Auction Collective ("TAC" or "We"), (ii) TAC acting as agent for the seller and providing services to the Bidder/Buyer, and (iii) the seller of the lot(s) consigned to TAC and being offered for sale ("Seller").
- TAC acts as the agent for the Seller and is authorised by the Seller to enter into a contract with the Bidder/Buyer to sell the Works.
- These Conditions, which set out the terms on which TAC will contract with the Bidder/Buyer, and all other terms and conditions applicable to the sale of Works offered by TAC, form the entire agreement between the Bidder/Buyer and TAC in its capacity as agent for the Seller.
- We have the right to amend these Conditions and shall inform You of any such amendments by posting notices on the TAC website, which is available at theauctioncollective.com/terms.
- You should read these Conditions carefully before participating in our auction sales ("Auction"). By registering to bid with TAC, you acknowledge that you shall be bound by these Conditions.
- Auction Items:
- All Works have a description (cataloguing) and image that has been supplied by the Seller or TAC. For example:

- b) TAC is reliant on the Seller of each of the Works to provide accurate information and accurate images of each of the Works ("Authorship Warranty"). We verify this information to the best of our ability, but we do not, carry out exhaustive due diligence on each of the Works. Bidder/Buyer acknowledge this fact and accept responsibility for carrying out inspections and investigations to satisfy Yourself as to any Work's description, condition and appearance, before You place a bid.
- c) All dimensions for Works are approximate measures of the items themselves and, unless otherwise stated, do not include additions such as frames or plinths. Images used in the promotion of the Auctions are for identification purposes only and cannot be relied on as precise indications of size or to convey full information as to the actual condition or appearance of the Work.
- TAC offers the opportunity for Bidder/Buyer to inspect Works in person, if You are interested in the Work before committing to bid in the Auction. All Works in the Auction are assumed to be in good condition by TAC unless otherwise stated. We do our best to review the condition of each Work and only offer Works that, for their age and provenance, are recognised as being in good in a condition.
- Each Bidder/Buyer is responsible for making full enquiry into the state of all Works, and by placing a bid at an Auction for a Work, you warrant that you are satisfied with the condition, accuracy of the description and appearance of each Work on which You wish to bid and have not relied on the information provided by the TAC.
- 2. Bidding and buying:
- Each Bidder/Buyer wishing to bid in an Auction must register prior to bidding by providing the relevant information as requested by the TAC. This is to ensure the relevant due diligence checks can been carried out. However, TAC still has discretion to refuse participation in the auction. You are able to register in the following ways and must register no later than three hours before the relevant Auction, on the website at theauctioncollective.com/register.

- b) Bidder/Buyer can bid in three ways either: in person, through absentee bids, or on the telephone.
- c) By submitting either an absentee or telephone bid, the Bidder/Buyer accepts that by passing the bid to TAC it might not be executed by the auctioneer or TAC staff as a result of either technical or human error. Absentee and telephone bids must be placed no later than three hours ahead of the Auction unless arranged with TAC directly. TAC will never bid higher than instructed.

- If a Work is not sold, the auctioneer will announce that it has been "unsold" "passed," "withdrawn," "returned to owner", "bought-in" or other such phrases that indicate the item has not sold.
- d) The auctioneer has discretion at any time to refuse any bid, withdraw any lot or re-offer a Work for sale (including after the fall of the hammer) if the auctioneer has reasonable belief that there has been an error or dispute during the sale of the Work. The auctioneer can then take any reasonable action to resolve the issue (i.e. reoffer the Work for sale). TAC shall have no liability for any such action taken by the auctioneer.
- The auctioneer has discretion to advance the bid increments in levels that are, in the auctioneer's opinion, appropriate for the pace of the auction. This may be larger or smaller than the standard increments. To maintain the confidential nature of the reserve on any Work, and to encourage bidding, the auctioneer may place one or more bids on behalf of the Seller up to the reserve. No single or partial exercise of any right or remedy provided under these Conditions or by law shall prevent or restrict the further exercise of that or any other right or remedy.
- c) Any notice given in connection with these Conditions shall be in writing and emailed, to the address that the Bidder/Buyer included when signing up to use the services of TAC. TAC's email address for the purpose of this clause is bids@theauctioncollective.com.
- d) If any provision or part-provision of these Conditions is or becomes invalid, illegal or unenforceable, it shall be deemed modified to the minimum extent necessary to make it valid, legal and enforceable. If such modification is not possible, the relevant provision or part-provision shall be deemed deleted. This does not affect any right or remedy of a third party which exists, or is available, apart from that Act
- g) Nothing in these Conditions will be construed to create a partnership, joint venture or agency relationship between the parties.
- h) No party will be liable for delay or failure in performing obligations if the delay or failure is caused by circumstances beyond its reasonable control, including but not limited to viruses, communication breakdowns, bank delays, bank errors, or government action.
- i) These Conditions, including any dispute arising out of or in connection with it, is governed by English law and each party submits to the exclusive jurisdiction of the English courts.
